- (1) Council Communications** - The Council and the school communicate regularly with parents through our email newsletter. - (2) Council Elections** – Council membership is open to all Wilkinson parents, guardians, and staff. It's a great way to get involved and to find out what's going on at your child's school. The Council meets monthly during the school year with the Principal and Vice-Principal to discuss and vote on school issues and to organize school events and fundraisers.

All members of the Wilkinson community are welcome to attend all Council meetings. Because Council membership cannot exceed 10% of the student population, in order to be a voting member of the Council, parents and guardians must be elected as per Ministry regulations. The Nomination Form and Election FAQ Sheet are on the following pages. Don't worry, the process is far less intimidating than it sounds! If you're interested in becoming a Council member, please submit the attached Nomination form according to the instructions. In the event that we have more than our allotment of submissions, an election via blind ballot will be held. The Executive Committee (Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer and Secretary) is elected by voting members at the October Council meeting. Minutes from past meetings are posted on our website as well.

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Wilkinson School Community Council Election FAQ

What is the Council's Purpose?

- The purpose of the Council is to improve student achievement and the accountability of the education system through the active participation of parents and guardians.

What is the Role of Council?

- An advisory body, that makes recommendations to the Principal of the school or to the Board on any matter.
- Consults with parents/guardians of students enrolled in the school about matters under consideration by the Council.
- Develops by-laws that govern election procedures, fill vacancies and a resolve conflicts.
- Keeps minutes of meetings and keeps financial records for a period of four years.
- Produces an annual written report of the Council activities, including financial activities, to be submitted to the Principal and to the Board.
- Focuses on improved learning for all students.
- Maintains a school-wide perspective on issues.
- Represents and communicates the views of the school community.

Who are the Members of Council?

- Elected parents, teachers, support staff, students where appropriate, appointed community representative(s), a representative from the Ontario Home and School Association, if such a group exists in the school and the Principal/Vice-Principal.

What is the Responsibility of a Council Member?

- Attend and contribute regularly at all Council meetings.
- Act as a link between the Council and the community.
- Follow the operating rules/guidelines as agreed upon by the Council, including the guidelines for resolving differences of opinion.
- Encourage others within the school community to participate in the activities of the Council.
- Communicate with various communities in the school and work towards removing any barriers to the participation of all members of the school community.
